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Federal Injunction Placed on FDA Approval of Mifepristone

This evening U.S. District Judge Matthew J. Kacsmaryk of Texas filed a federal injunction against the Food and Drug Administration's (FDA) approval of the drug, mifepristone (Mifeprex), the first pill taken during a medication abortion. Starting in seven days, this halts all prescription and distribution of the drug until further testing is done of mifepristone to prove it does not harm women. The injunction will likely be appealed by the Biden Administration, where there is a high possibility of the case making its way to the Supreme Court of the United States.

Future Medical Professionals for Life (FMPFL) fully supports the injunction instated by Judge Kacsmaryk. Evidenced-based professional medical organizations including the American Association of Pro-Life OBGYNs among other members of the Alliance for Hippocratic Medicine have appealed to the courts the need for this injunction based on the clear and present harm done to patients who come into their offices.

As documented by Dr. Maarit Niinimäki, PhD., medication abortion presents at least four times the rate of adverse events as surgical abortion, not accounting for adverse mental health outcomes. The United States lacks a federal abortion reporting law which would require abortionists to accurately report the number of adverse outcomes including all mortalities their procedures and drugs result in, including hemorrhage, infection and sepsis, deaths from undiagnosed ectopic pregnancies, and more.

The Board of Directors of FMPFL joins the community of Hippocratic medical professionals and students to assert the need to protect the life of women, born and preborn, by encouraging the FDA to truthfully investigate the harm mifepristone perpetrates and act accordingly. Enough women are dying due to false health care practices.
